Thomas Watson, "The Doctrine of Repentance" (1668)

Repentance is a grace of God's Spirit, whereby a sinner is inwardly humbled and outwardly reformed. Repentance is a spiritual medicine made up of six special ingredients:

- 1. Sight of sin
- 2. Sorrow for sin
- 3. Confession of sin
- 4. Shame for sin
- 5. Hatred for sin
- 6. Turning from sin

If any ingredient is left out, it loses its virtue.
