### Hymns for the Season

We have entered the season of Advent and a few of the hymns we will be singing this morning date back many years:

**O Come, O Come, Emmanuel** - 12th Century Latin Hymn

**Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus** - Written & published by Charles Wesley in 1744.

**O Savior of Our Fallen Race** - 6th Century Latin Hymn

**Let All Mortal Flesh Keep Silence** - Many scholars believe this hymn dates back to 60 A.D., the same time that Paul was writing Romans. This liturgy is believed to be perhaps the oldest liturgy developed for the church. Since the text points to Jesus offering the "gift of Himself as heavenly food," it makes the perfect hymn for this morning's communion service.
