Afflicted Saint to Christ Draw Near

An orphan at the age of twelve, John Fawcett became apprenticed to a tailor and was largely self-educated. He was converted by the preaching of George Whitefield at the age of sixteen and began preaching soon thereafter. In 1765 Fawcett was called to a small, poor, Baptist country church in Wainsgate, Yorkshire. Seven years later he received a call from the large and influential Carter's Lane Church in London, England. Fawcett accepted the call and preached his farewell sermon. The day of departure came, and his family's belongings were loaded on carts, but the distraught congregation begged him to stay. When love and tears prevailed, Dr. Fawcett sacrificed the attraction of a London pulpit to the affection of his poor but devoted flock. The hymn, Afflicted Saint to Christ Draw Near was written by Fawcett in 1772 to commemorate the determination to remain with the people at Wainsgate, where he faithfully served the remainder of his active ministry.
