Christ Surrendered All

This morning, we will sing Christ Surrendered All. The hymn lyrics, written by Zac Hicks in 2014, offers a reorientation of the classic hymn / worship song, "I Surrender All." Mr. Hicks wrote an article for the Gospel Coalition in which he said there was an overload of "I'm surrendering it all to You, Jesus" in our worship songs. He argued this phrase tends to put way too much spotlight on what we do for God rather than what Christ has done for us.

Notice the difference in lyrics:

I surrender all

VS

Christ, You surrendered all

Worldly pleasures all forsaken Take me, Jesus, take me now

VS

Worldly pleasures I was seeking Still, Lord, You were seeking me

In addition to the message of the song, which really is the raw Gospel, we strive to reinforce and re-preach that same message:

"It's not about what I do, Lord, but about what you have done for me."
