Praise My Soul the King of Heaven

This morning we will open our time of worship with two great hymns of praise. In 1834, Henry F. Lyte wrote the lyrics to "Praise, my Soul, the King of Heaven." Lyte's text speaks to the love of God and our dependence on Him in a clear and imaginative way. Think of what might happen if we woke up every day with these words on our lips: "Ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven, evermore His praises sing." How would our lives change if we walked through our days singing "Alleluia!" or through our times of sorrow declaring that we rest in the gentle hand of God? This is a text with beautiful imagery and thoughtful prose that, like Psalm 103, gives us words to praise our God with heart, mind, and soul.
