This morning we will be singing the beloved well-known hymn, "Come Ye Sinners, Poor and Needy," and invite sinners to seek forgiveness and salvation through Jesus Christ. The hymn was written by Joseph Hart, an independent Calvinist preacher who experienced a spiritual awakening in 1757. His journey from a "loose backslider" to a devoted Christian deeply influenced the hymn's themes of grace and redemption. The hymn was first published in Hart's collection "Hymns Composed on Various Subjects" in 1759, under the title "Come, and welcome, to Jesus Christ".

The hymn emphasizes God's grace and mercy, portraying Christ as ready to receive those burdened by sin. It calls for repentance and encourages individuals to come to Jesus for forgiveness.

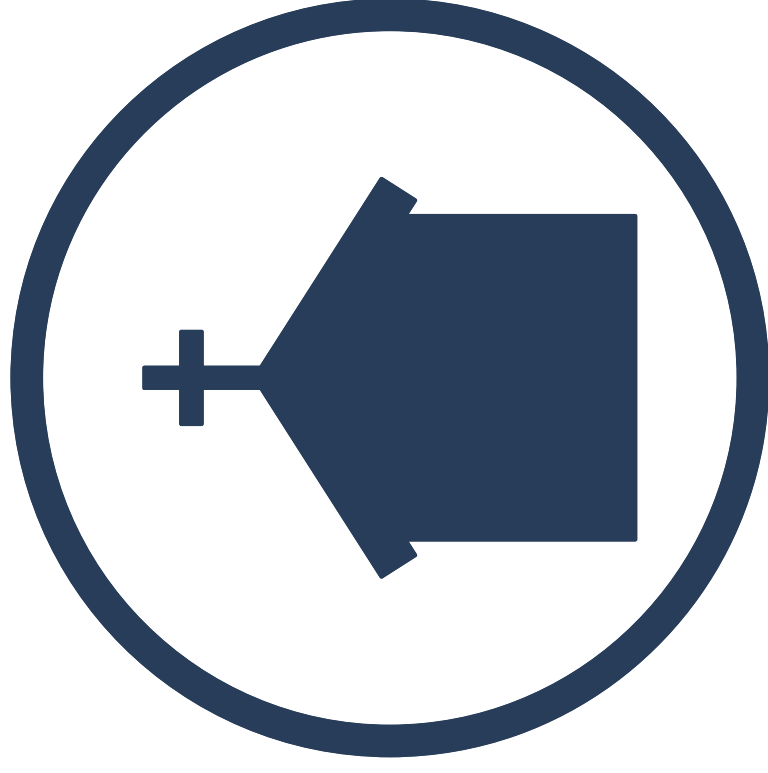
The lyrics reflect a compassionate invitation, highlighting the helpless condition of sinners and the abundant grace available through faith in Christ. Each verse serves as a heartfelt appeal for sinners to abandon self-reliance and accept the free gift of salvation.
