The Advent of Christ

Today begins the first of four Sundays of Advent, a meaningful season for reflecting and preparing our hearts and minds for the arrival of Jesus. Sometimes we are tempted to be discouraged, to doubt that He is coming back, because it has been two thousand years since His ascension. But the people of God had to wait millennia for His first advent, and their faith was vindicated when He was born in Bethlehem. Our faith will be vindicated as well when our Savior comes in glory.

This morning, we will be singing the ancient hymns, O Come, O Come, Emmanuel (dating back to the 8th century), as well as Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus, written by Charles Wesley in 1744. Although, these hymns were written for the birth of Christ, the beautifully captured words of these hymns also reflect our yearning for Christ's return. For though we know that Christ goes with us and before us every day, we long for the day when we are with Him in all of the fullness and glory He will bring. We long for the day when we are with Him in a New Heaven and New Earth, when all things are made new.
