## A STATEMENT CONSIDERING THE LORD'S TABLE

We here at Crosspoint Fellowship do not consider this table our table, but it is the Lord's Table.

We consider this time a Holy Communion, which is given to His whole church and signifies our abiding faith and communion in Jesus Christ. Therefore, we are happy to welcome all baptized Christians in good standing (i.e., not under discipline) with an evangelical branch of Christ's Church (i.e., Protestant) to receive Communion here. If you are abiding in unrepentant sin and are unwilling to leave this sin for Christ, we ask that you not take Communion until you have had an opportunity to speak with one of our Elders.
