## What E'er My God Ordains is Right

This morning, we will sing the ancient hymn, What E'er My God Ordains is Right, which was written by Samuel Rodigast in 1675. Charles Spurgeon once preached, "The moment we are reconciled to God, we consent that Jehovah should do as he wills. What better rule could be than the absolute empire of love? . . . Let love reign without limit; let love be sovereign; let love bear the keys of government upon her shoulder, and let her name be called the mighty God. . . . When the heart is reconciled to God, we can say, 'Amen, so let it be, what God ordains must be right.'"
